The system of symbols that Conrad sets up subtly shift and change as we journey through the novella. And Marlow's attitudes and undeniably racist language "typical of a seaman of that time who was seeking his fortune and adventure in such a way" does seem to shift slightly. He talks of Conrad's hatred of black skin and quotes a glowing description of a white body when Conrad first arrived in England. But we don't know the context for these outside descriptions, and the latter quote was from when he was just sixteen long before he went to Congo. But I do feel to see the novel only as a social product rather than an artistic one, is to cut yourself off from so much that it has to offer to us as readers. Joseph Conrad's *Heart of Darkness* is among the most studied, debated, contested, and theorized works of Western literature. The novel can be viewed through many critical lenses. A post-colonial reading might critique, celebrate, and even reconcile Europe's colonialization activities throughout Africa in the 19th century. A Marxist reading might point to ways in which the story depicts the violence and cultural repression which surrounds capitalistic enterprises. A psychoanalytic reading might focus on the complicated psyches of Kurtz or Marlow and explore their unique psychological motivations.

Joseph Conrad, English author of Polish descent whose works include the novel *Lord Jim* and the short story *Heart of Darkness*. It was Conrad's first English landfall, and he spoke only a few words of the language of which he was to become a recognized master. Conrad remained in England, and in the following October he shipped as an ordinary seaman aboard a wool clipper on the London-Sydney run.

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
