### HISTORY OF GEOLOGY

Geology is the science and study of the composition, structure, properties, and history of the Earth, as well as the processes by which it is formed, moved, and changed. The field is a major academic discipline, and is commercially important for mineral and hydrocarbon extraction, as well as for predicting and understanding earthquakes and volcanic eruptions.

William Smith (1769–1839) drew some of the first geological maps and began the process of ordering rock strata (layers) by examining the fossils contained in them. James Hutton is often viewed as the first modern geologist. In 1785, he presented a paper entitled "Theory of the Earth" to the Royal Society of Edinburgh.
