Tudors & Stuarts & the issue of Religion Monarch How He/She Dealt with Religious Issues Henry VIII Established Anglican Church after breaking with the Catholic pope Mary I Wanted to restore Catholicism to England; was called "Bloody Mary" when she had Protestant dissenters burned at the stake. Elizabeth I Strengthened Protestantism by making those who did not attend the Anglican Church pay fines Mary Queen of Scots Plotted to kill Elizabeth I and rule England as a Catholic nation; was caught and beheaded.
